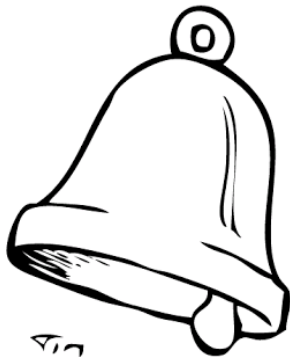
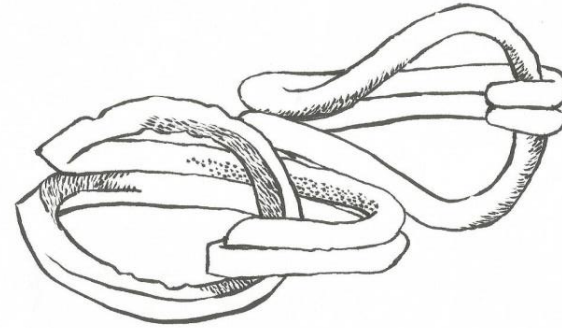


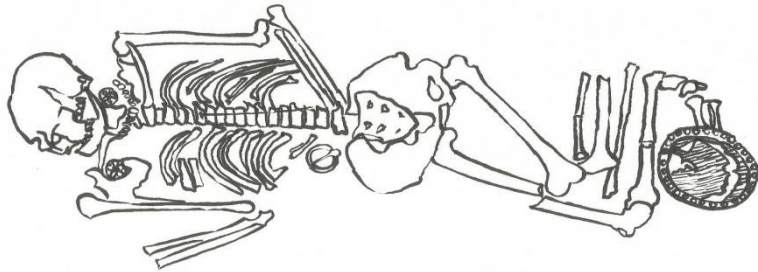
Simple Guide to Barbican House Museum



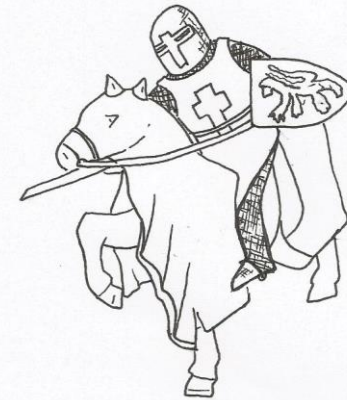
Buy your ticket from the welcome desk. This building used to be a house. You can see the servants' bells in the shop.



The Prehistory Gallery contains artefacts from the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. These are pieces of bronze age jewellery called Sussex Loops.



The Roman and Anglo-Saxon Gallery contains artefacts 1500 to 2000 years old. This is an Anglo-Saxon skeleton of a woman buried with special objects.

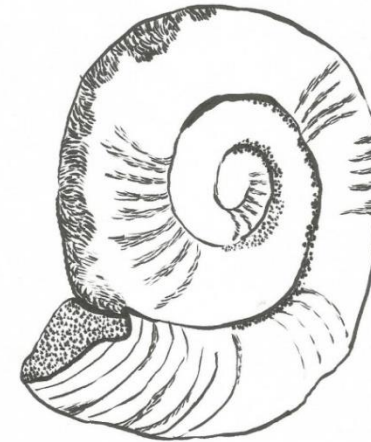


In the mini-cinema you can watch a film about Lewes. You can see a model of the town of Lewes. The tapestry on the wall tells the story of the Battle of Lewes.

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In the Medieval Gallery there is a tile of King Edward I. The artefacts in this gallery are from about 600-1000 years ago.

There are guides and stories to listen to. You can also visit the library but you need to ask at the front desk.
