Main purpose of the role:	To help maintain the gardens at Lewes Castle, Anne of Cleves House and Michelham Priory
Time commitment:	Michelham Priory: 9:30 – 15:00 Tuesdays and/or Fridays (Duration of shift is flexible).
	Lewes Castle/Anne Of Cleves: 10:00 – 12:00 Wednesdays (But there is a hope to expand this timing/date as the team grows)
	We are fairly flexible in terms of time commitment, and ideally would ask for a minimum commitment of around 1 shift a fortnight.
