Visual Story for a school group visit



This is the coach park. If I am arriving by a coach, this is where I will get off

In the museum, I can see lots of really old objects that the Romans used to use



In the museum, I can also see a life sized model of what a roman room might have looked like 2000 years ago.



There are lots of mosaics I can look at too. A mosaic is a picture the Romans had on their floors. Mosaics are made from lots of very small tiles.



There is an area with lots of activities to do. There are things I can build, things I can sort, and things I can draw. It can get quite noisy in here if there are lots of people around



The garden is a copy of what the Roman garden used to look like. I can see lots of hedges that make up a nice pattern.



I can also see the Roman plant garden. In this area, there will be lots of different plants and trees. Some might smell nice, others might have bright coloured flowers.



If I want learn more about the gardens, I can visit the small garden museum at the back.



Inside the garden museum, I can see a model of a Roman gardener. I don't need to be scared, he is just a mannequin.



If I am having a workshop, it will be in one of the Workshop rooms



I will start the workshop by sitting on the carpet with my group and listening to the introduction



I will then get a chance to try lots of different activities



I might even be able to play in a Roman kitchen



There might be some dressing up as well



When it's time to have lunch, I might have it in this room



If the weather is nice, I might be able eat outside on the picnic benches or the grass
