I hope you have enjoyed finding out about the Romans here at Fishbourne.


Come back and visit us soon.













The Museum









Find me by the Roman Army Display.

Write the name of one of the plants and draw a picture of, or write about, what it was used for.




Look Hard at the Roman Army display!


A pot used in the dining room







Draw a roof tile.

Draw it in the box.


Why do you think it is there?

The North Wing



This is a hypocaust. It was under the floor and heated the room.

Draw in the missing parts which held the floor up.

A **mosaic** floor would have been on top of it. Can you see the **old** mosaic floor under it, though?

The Romans had fires in the middle of their rooms before they built hypocausts.
