Please ensure that you advise our staff in advance of any allergies and any medical requirements when booking our Roman Food workshop (part of an Experience Day).

Our food is purchased from a supermarket to minimise cross-contamination, and we can therefore show you the packaging to ensure that it is suitable for all of your participants.

Please check that the foods provided (including their ingredients and allergens) are suitable for your party. Please note that this is **not** a definitive list of ingredients and allergens, and there is still a risk of crosscontamination. Please speak to us in

Further Notes:

- Please remember that the supervision of your pupils remains your responsibility throughout your visit.
- It is your responsibility to ensure that you have a **first aider present** with your school party. We do have trained first aiders amongst our staff but cannot guarantee their availability on the day of your visit.
- We highly recommend that group leaders conduct preliminary visits before bringing their pupils.
- Please contact the nearest member of staff in case of accident or emergency, no matter how minor.
- No food or drink is permitted in the workshops, museum, mosaic area, gardens, or Collections Discovery Centre.
- Please advise pupils to inform a museum staff member if they become separated from the group.
- School groups should avoid bringing nuts or nut products onto our site. [Please note that the café is run by a separate company and does sell products containing nuts.]
- *Our wheat (contains GLUTEN) is from Doves Farm and is cleaned and does not reference any possible contamination with nuts on the packaging. Therefore, the flour used in our workshops should not contain traces of nuts, but there is a risk of cross contamination by participants and we are **not a nut free site.**
- If the fire alarm sounds, please make your way calmly via the nearest emergency exit to the assembly point. The two assembly points are 1) by the gazebo outside the café, or 2) on the raised bank in the garden (next to the Audio-Visual Theatre). Please ensure that all members of your party are aware of these. Attendant staff will supervise the evacuation of the building. Please register your pupils and adults and inform us immediately if there are any issues.
